
CANS National Benchmarking Project

- In 2015, Magellan and LDH began sharing CANS data with the University of Washington's Wraparound Research and Evaluation Team (WERT).
- Goal: To better understand how the CANS is being used in Wraparound programs across the nation with a goal to provide guidance for program and system-level CANS usage, including:
 - What are the typical strengths and needs of Wraparoundenrolled youth and families?
 - How much change can programs and systems can expect to see in CANS scores over time?
 - How do CANS scores vary across states and sites?



CANS and Wraparound are being implemented in nearly every state





CANS: Identifying Actionable Needs




Each CANS item is scored on a 0-3 scale, corresponding to need for action.

Level of action corresponding to Rating	Check	FAMILY Functioning Please rate the highest level form the past 30 days
No Evidence	0	Child is doing well in relationships with family members.
Watchful waiting/prevention Indicates item is an "Actionable Need"	1	Child is doing adequately in relationships with family members although some problems may exist. For example, some family members may have some problems in their relationships with child.
maicates item is an Actionable Need		Child is having moderate problems with parents, siblings and/or
Action	2	other family members. Frequent arguing, difficulties in maintaining any positive relationship may be observed.
Immediate/Intensive Action	3	Child is having severe problems with parents, siblings, and/or other family members. This would include problems of domestic violence, constant arguing, etc.

- Strengths are scored based on their usefulness for planning from 0, "Centerpiece Strength" to 3, "No Strength Identified"
- Scored by a professional administers based on their knowledge of the youth and family, typically every 3-6 months

How does Louisiana Compare?


At enrollment, the typical LA youth has 3 more actionable needs*



*Based on 40 "core" items from National Dataset

~50% of youth

Baseline Needs Vary across Programs




There is considerable site-level variation in the number of Baseline needs.

Based on National Dataset of 50 possible needs/strengths items


Ratings of Top Five Most Commonly Prevalent Actionable Needs at Baseline by Site



Conclusion: Louisiana CSoC is enrolling the targeted population-children and youth at high risk of out of home placement.

Needed more data to explore sitelevel differences




Presented at CMH
