Summary of Changes:

New policy.

Scope:

This policy outlines value-added non-emergency transportation benefit to all eligible Humana Healthy Horizons[™] in Louisiana (Plan) members.

Policy:

Non-emergency and medical transportation is a are covered services for mandatory and voluntary opt-in population as contractually mandated. To supplement those the covered services, Humana Health HorizonsTM in Louisiana offers a limited value-added non-emergency transportation benefit to all eligible Humana Louisiana (Plan) members when no other means of transportation is available.

Healthy Horizons[™] in Louisiana covers as a value-add non-emergency transportation:

- Ride to medical appointment with stop at pharmacy for medications, ages 18+;
- Up to 30 one-way rides to grocery store, social support, and <u>medical and non-medical</u> value-added services, ages 18+; and [VG1][BDR2]
- Member may travel with one (1) attendant <u>for medical and non-medical value-added</u> <u>services.[vG3][bDR4][bDR5][vG6][bDR7]</u>

Procedures:

All value-added non-emergency transportation must be scheduled by the member through the transportation broker following the criteria below:

- Members are expected to give at least 48 hours² advance notice when requesting transportation;
- The transportation broker shall verify, prior to scheduling, member eligibility determination;
- No prior authorization is required;
- <u>Attendant verification is required by the transportation broker;</u>
- Benefits includes <u>a stop at the</u> pharmacy for medications when immediately following a Medicaid_ covered medical appointment;
- Up to<u>Members are allowed an overall total of</u>-30 one-way rides-transports to both medical and nonmedical value added services, including transports to the grocery store and, social support services, and both medical and non-medical_value-added services[v68][BDR9][v610][BDR11][V612];
- The <u>transportation</u> broker will maintain and validate <u>each</u> member<u>'s</u> 30 one-way service limits;
- The <mark>Vyalue-added services</mark> transportation [VG13][BDR14]benefit-must:
 - <u>Must</u> remain within the member's transportation service area and no greater than 30 miles;

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- Must meet travel pickup and/or drop-off wait time requirements, as well as all healthcare provider business hours, as specified in the Medicaid Medical Transportation Provider Manual[vg15]
- <u>Valued-added services transportation hours are limited to those that meet travel pickup and/or</u> <u>drop-off wait time requirements as specified in the Medical Transportation Provider Manual and</u> <u>business hours at transportation service location;</u>
- Public providers of mass transit systems shall be considered in benefit delivery;
- All <u>transportationNEMT providers</u> must meet the requirements as outlined in the <u>Medicaid</u> Medical Transportation Provider Manual. <u>This includes with</u> all vehicle and driver compliance records, including all required licensure and credentialing, maintained and verified by the <u>transportation enrollment</u> broker; [VG16] [BDR17]
- Claims must be submitted with 365 days of service by the transportation <u>NEMT</u> provider to the transportation broker[vg18][BDR19], including all member, provider, pick-up, drop-off, and mileage information necessary to establish a claim;
- Medical appointments will take precedence over value-added trips at all times; and
- All medical and non-medical value-added trip encounters will be submitted in the manner as directed by LDH in accordance with the MCO System Companion Guide.

Eligibility determination (must meet all criteria):

- Ages 18+; and
- Any members with either P-linkage or B-linkage.

The following services may be considered as -meeting the criteria to contribute to the health and well_ being of members:

- Social support groups;
- Wellness classes;
- WIC and SNAP appointments;
- Food banks;
- Job interviews;
- Faith-based events; and
- Applicable value-added benefit services offered.

This benefit also offers transportation to locations providing social benefits and community integration for members such as community and neighborhood centers, parks, recreation areas[vg20][BDR21], and churches.

The following services are not covered as a value-added transportation benefit and will not be administered to members under this plan:

- Transportation to home and community-based waiver services which are covered under LDH feefor-service;
- Ride to <u>healthcare</u> providers or facilities located outside of the state or country;
- Non-emergency ambulance transportation; and non-ambulatory transportation (VG22)[BDR23];
- Hospice care;
- Nursing facilities;
- Gas reimbursement;
- <u>Ride to a pharmacy as part of a geo-access request;</u> and
- Value-added benefits are not eligible for <u>member</u> reimbursement.

Definitions:

B-linkage – Refers to enrollment in an MCO for specialized behavioral health and non-emergency medical transportation.

<u>Medical Value-Added Benefit – Extra benefit offered by Humana beyond Medicaid-covered services that</u> is administrated by a contracted health care service provider and delivered at a medical site, such as both adult dental and vision services.

Non-Medical Value-Added Benefit – Extra benefit offered by Humana beyond Medicaid-covered services that contributes to the health and well-being of members and unlikely to be delivered at a medical site, such as gym membership and drowning prevention classes.

<u>Neighborhood Center – An area wherein an activity occurs which provides services of a social, cultural, economic, or educational nature to the neighborhood in which it is located.</u>

Park – An area devoted to human enjoyment and recreation.

P-linkage – Refers[vG24][BDR25] to enrollment in an MCO for <u>physical health</u>, <u>specialized</u> behavioral health and non-emergency medical transportation.

Prior Authorization – The process of determining medical necessity for specific services before they are rendered.

Recreational Area – An area devoted to human enjoyment that serves for recreational purposes, such as parks, playgrounds, sports fields, and school yards.

Social Services – Services that contributes to the health and well-being of members which may include social support groups, wellness classes, WIC and SNAP appointments, food banks, job interviews, faith-based events, and applicable <u>medical and non-medical</u> value-added benefit services offered.

Transportation Broker – <u>T</u>the business entity designated by Humana to manage the coordination and provision of non-emergency medical, and <u>medical and non-medical</u> value-added transportation services <u>in accordance with 42 CFR § 440.170(a)(4) and can provide the services described in the Attachment A:</u> <u>Model Contract.</u>[VG26][BDR27]

Value-Added Benefit – The additional benefit outside of MCO Covered Services that are delivered at Humana's discretion.
