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Overview

Deluxe frames are non-standard frames and are considered medically necessary for specific diagnoses and specific age members.

Clinical Criteria

March Vision has determined the following to be medically necessary for deluxe frames:

- Acquired deformity of the nose
- Cauliflower ear
- Deformity of the head
- Encephalocele (frontal, nasofrontal, and occipital)
- Microcephaly
- Arhiencephaly
- Holoprosencephaly
- Absence of ear
- Malformation of ear
- Accessory auricle
- Macrotia
- Microtia
- Misplaced ear
- Prominent Ear
- Agensis and underdevelopment of the nose
- Malformation of the nose
- Congenital facial asymmetry
- Congenital compression facies
- Dolichocephaly
- Piagiocephaly
- Congenital deformities or malformations of the skull, face, and jaw
- Craniosynostosis
- Cranial dysostosis
- Hypertelorism
- Macrocephaly
- Mandibulofacial dysostosis

- Oculomandibular dysostosis
- Dysmorphism due to warfarin
- Trisomy 21
- Trisomy 18
- Trisomy 13
- Whole chromosome trisomy
- Partial trisomy
