The Department of Health, Bureau of Health Services

Financing proposes to amend LAC 50:I.3509 in the Medical

Assistance Program as authorized by R.S. 36:254 and pursuant to

Title XIX of the Social Security Act. This proposed Rule is

promulgated in accordance with the provisions of the

Administrative Procedure Act, R.S. 49:950 et seq.

The Department of Health, Bureau of Health Services

Financing promulgated a Notice of Intent which proposed to amend
the provisions governing managed care for physical and
behavioral health to ensure the Louisiana Administrative Code
accurately reflects the current reimbursement methodology for
federally qualified health centers (FQHCs) and rural health
clinics (RHCs) (Louisiana Register, Volume 49, Number 1). As a
result of comments received, the department determined it was
necessary to abandon the Notice of Intent published in the
January 20, 2023 edition of the Louisiana Register.

The department now proposes to promulgate a revised Notice of Intent to amend the provisions governing managed care for

physical and behavioral health in order to further clarify the reimbursement methodology currently in use for FQHCs and RHCs.
