State Plan Amendment for Submittal to CMS
Request for Tribal Comments
April 11, 2023

Personal Care Services – Long Term (LT-PCS)

Effective date: May 12, 2023

The purpose of this SPA is to extend the COVID-19 disaster relief provisions governing long-term personal care services as follows:

1. Allow exceptions to the requirements that services must be provided in accordance with the approved plan of care and supporting documentation, to authorize hours up to 32 hours per week, if needed;
2. Allow the beneficiary's curator, tutor, responsible representative, or the person to whom the beneficiary has given representative and mandate authority (Power of Attorney), to serve as the direct service worker for the beneficiary, unless they are legally responsible relatives;
3. Allow LT-PCS to be provided in another state without prior approval of the Office of Aging and Adult Services (OAAS) or its designee;
4. Allow a beneficiary to receive LT-PCS while living in a home or property owned, operated or controlled by a provider of services who is not related by blood or marriage to the beneficiary; and
5. Allow exceptions to the prior authorization requirements.
6. Allow exceptions to the age, education and experience for the personal care services worker qualifications.
