State Plan Amendment for Submittal to CMS

Request for Tribal Comments

June 17, 2024

Third Party Liability Effective date: May 23, 2024

The purpose of this SPA is to amend the provisions governing third party liability in order to:

- 1. Require that a third party accepts authorization provided by the Department that an item or service is covered under the State Plan, as if the authorization were a prior authorization made by the third party for the item or service;
- 2. Bar a third party from denying a claim based on failure to obtain prior authorization when certain criteria are met;
- 3. Modify the existing timeframe for a third party to respond to inquiries made by the Department; and
- 4. Bar a third party from denying a claim submitted by the Department solely on the basis of submission of the claim, the type or format of the claim form, or a failure to present proper documentation at the point-of-sale that is the basis of the claim.
