


## ONLY HALF OF YOUTH LIVING WITH HIV IN THE U.S. ARE VIRALLY SUPPRESSED.

Viral suppression is when a person has very low levels of HIV in their blood. People who are virally suppressed cannot pass HIV on to sex partners.

It is estimated that
half the young people
living with HIV are undiagnosed
and unaware of their status.




## BLACK YOUTH ARE MORE AFFECTED BY HIV THAN OTHER YOUTH.

Only 38% of Louisiana youth are Black,
BUT 78% of youth diagnosed with HIV are Black.

Among trans women diagnosed with HIV in Louisiana, 1 in 3 were Trans Youth.







Only 54% of Louisiana youth living with HIV are virally suppressed.

For young people living with HIV:

Achieving viral suppression is very important in order to lead a long, healthy life with HIV.

When a person is virally suppressed, they cannot pass HIV on to sex partners.
