

Region 3—Houma STD / HIV Update

CHLAMYDIA—REGION 3


- In 2015, there were **2,482** new diagnoses of chlamydia in Region 3 for a rate of **611.8** per 100,000. Region 3 had the **7th** highest chlamydia rate out of all 9 public health regions in Louisiana.
 - 74% of the new chlamydia diagnoses were female, 26% were male.
 - Among persons with known race/ethnicity, **63**% of the diagnoses were black, **31**% were white, **3**% were Hispanic/Latino, and **3**% were among persons of other races/ethnicities.
 - 34% of the chlamydia diagnoses were in persons under the age of 20 years old, 38% were 20-24 years old, 17% were 25-29 years old, and 11% were 30 or older.

GONORRHEA—REGION 3

- In 2015, there were **723** new diagnoses of gonorrhea in Region 3 for a rate of **178.2** per 100,000. Region 3 had the **6th** highest gonorrhea rate out of all 9 public health regions in Louisiana.
 - 59% of the new gonorrhea diagnoses were female, 41% were male.
 - Among persons with known race/ethnicity, **74%** of the diagnoses were black, **22%** were white, nearly **2%** were Hispanic/Latino, and **3%** were among persons of other races/ethnicities.
 - 28% of the gonorrhea diagnoses were in persons under the age of 20, 36% were 20-24 years old, 20% were 25-29 years old, and 17% were 30 or older.

CONGENITAL SYPHILIS—REGION 3

Congenital syphilis is increasing in Region 3.

- In 2013, 2 cases of congenital syphilis were reported.
- In 2014, there were 6 cases reported from Region 3.
- In 2015, there were **7** cases of congenital syphilis reported.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS—REGION 3

- In 2013, 21 persons were diagnosed with P&S syphilis for a rate of 5.2 per 100,000.
- In 2014, 54 persons were diagnosed with P&S syphilis for a rate of 13.3 per 100,000.
- In 2015, **43** persons were diagnosed with P&S syphilis for a rate of **10.6** per 100,000. In 2015, Region 3 had the **6th** highest P&S syphilis rate out of all 9 public health regions in Louisiana.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY SEX AT BIRTH

The proportion of P&S syphilis diagnoses among females is increasing in Region 3.

• In 2013, **90%** of new P&S syphilis diagnoses were among males. This proportion dropped to **61%** in 2014 and to **51%** in 2015. In 2015, **49%** of P&S syphilis diagnoses were female.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY RACE/ETHNICITY

The proportion of P&S syphilis diagnoses among blacks is decreasing in Region 3.

- In 2013, 76% of all P&S syphilis diagnoses were among blacks. In 2015 this proportion dropped to 67%.
- In 2013, 24% of all P&S syphilis diagnoses were among whites. This proportion rose to 28% in 2015.
- In 2013 and 2014 there were no P&S syphilis diagnoses among persons of other races/ethnicities, while in 2015, 5% of diagnoses were among American Indians/Alaskan Natives.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY AGE GROUP

- The proportion of P&S syphilis diagnoses for persons under the age of 30 years increased from **57**% in 2013 to **72**% in 2014 and 2015.
- The proportion of diagnoses for persons 30-39 years increased from 10% in 2013 to 19% in 2014 and 2015.
- The proportion of diagnoses for person 40 and older was 33% in 2013 but just 9% in 2014 and 2015.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY PARISH

• In 2015, the majority of new P&S syphilis diagnoses were in Terrebonne Parish and Lafourche Parish.

NEW HIV DIAGNOSES—REGION 3

- In 2013, 58 persons were diagnosed with HIV for a rate of 14.3 per 100,000.
- In 2014, 52 persons were diagnosed with HIV for a rate of 12.8 per 100,000.
- In 2015, **68** persons were diagnosed with HIV for a rate of **16.8** per 100,000. In 2015, Region 3 had the **7th** highest HIV diagnoses rate out of all 9 public health regions in Louisiana.

HIV DIAGNOSES BY SEX AT BIRTH

• In 2013, **71%** of new HIV diagnoses were among males. This proportion dropped to **67%** in 2014 and returned to **71%** in 2015. In 2015, 29% of new HIV diagnoses were female.

HIV BY RACE/ETHNICITY

The proportion of new HIV diagnoses among blacks is fluctuating in Region 3.

• In 2013, **64%** of all HIV diagnoses were black and **34%** were white. In 2014, **52%** of HIV diagnoses were black and **37%** were white. In 2015, **62%** of the HIV diagnoses were black and **29%** were white.

HIV DIAGNOSES BY AGE GROUP

- Youth age 15-24 years old, accounted for 22% of all new HIV diagnoses in 2013, 37% in 2014, and 29% in 2015.
- Persons age 25-34 years accounted for an additional 26% of new diagnoses in 2013, 33% in 2014, and 29% in 2015.
- In 2013, persons age 35-44 accounted for 22% of new diagnoses, 37% in 2014, and 29% in 2015.
- In 2013, persons 45 and older accounted for 36% of HIV diagnoses, 17% in 2014, and 22% in 2015.

HIV DIAGNOSES BY PARISH, 2013-2015

• In 2015, the majority of new HIV diagnoses occurred in Lafourche and Terrebonne Parish.

NEW HIV DIAGNOSES BY RISK CATEGORY

- In 2013, **75%** of HIV diagnoses reported being men who have sex with men (MSM). This decreased to **72%** in 2014 and **65%** in 2015.
- From 2013 to 2015, the proportion of new diagnoses among injection drug users increased from **3**% in 2013 to **9**% in 2015. This is an important group to monitor.
- From 2013 to 2015, 23% of new diagnoses reported being high risk heterosexuals (HRH).
- From 2013 to 2015, there has been one case of mother to child transmission of HIV.

In 2014, Louisiana ranked 1st in the nation for Congenital Syphilis rates; 1st for Gonorrhea rates; 2nd for HIV rates; 2nd for AIDS rates; 2nd for Primary and Secondary Syphilis rates, and 3rd for Chlamydia rates.
