

Region 8—Monroe STD / HIV Update

CHLAMYDIA—REGION 8


- In 2015, there were **3,026** new diagnoses of chlamydia in Region 8 for a rate of **850.0** per 100,000. Region 8 had the **2nd** highest chlamydia rate out of all 9 public health regions in Louisiana.
 - 73% of the new chlamydia diagnoses were female, 27% were male.
 - Among persons with known race/ethnicity, 84% of the diagnoses were black, 15% were white, and 1% were among persons of other races/ethnicities.
 - 36% of the chlamydia diagnoses were in persons under the age of 20 years old, 36% were 20-24 years old, 16% were 25-29 years old, and 11% were 30 or older.

GONORRHEA—REGION 8

- In 2015, there were **1,066** new diagnoses of gonorrhea in Region 8 for a rate of **299.4** per 100,000. Region 8 had the **highest** gonorrhea rate out of all 9 public health regions in Louisiana.
 - 56% of the new gonorrhea diagnoses were female, 44% were male.
 - Among persons with known race/ethnicity, 89% of the diagnoses were black, 10% were white, and 1% were among persons of other races/ethnicities.
 - **36**% of the gonorrhea diagnoses were in persons under the age of 20, **33**% were 20-24 years old, **16**% were 25-29 years old, and **14**% were 30 or older.

CONGENITAL SYPHILIS—REGION 8

Congenital syphilis has significantly increased in Region 8.

- In 2013, 5 cases of congenital syphilis were reported.
- In 2014, there were **7** cases reported from Region 8.
- In 2015, there were **13** cases of congenital syphilis reported. In 2015, Region 8 tied with Region 2 for the **highest** number of CS cases.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS—REGION 8

From 2013-2015, the number of P&S syphilis diagnoses in Region 8 has almost tripled.

- In 2013, **30** persons were diagnosed with P&S syphilis for a rate of **8.4** per 100,000.
- In 2014, **56** persons were diagnosed with P&S syphilis for a rate of **15.7** per 100,000.
- In 2015, **81** persons have been diagnosed with P&S syphilis for a rate of **22.8** per 100,000. In 2015, Region 8 had the **highest** P&S syphilis rate out of all 9 public health regions in Louisiana.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY SEX AT BIRTH

• In 2013, **67**% of new P&S syphilis diagnoses were among males. This proportion dropped to **61**% in 2014 and returned to **67**% in 2015. In 2015, **33**% of P&S syphilis diagnoses were among females.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY RACE/ETHNICITY

The majority of new diagnoses are among blacks in Region 8.

- In 2013, **83**% of all P&S syphilis diagnoses were among blacks. In 2014, this proportion rose to **91%**, and in 2015, **89**% of all P&S syphilis diagnoses were among blacks.
- In 2013, **17**% of all P&S syphilis diagnoses were among whites. This decreased to **9**% in 2014 and increased to **11**% in 2015.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY AGE GROUP

The proportion of P&S syphilis diagnoses among persons under the age of 30 is increasing in Region 8.

- The proportion of diagnoses for persons under the age of 30 increased from **53**% in 2013 to **78**% in 2015.
- The proportion of diagnoses for persons 30-39 years decreased from 30% in 2013 to 12% in 2015.
- The proportion of diagnoses for person 40 and older was 17% in 2013 but just 10% in 2015.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY PARISH

• In 2015, the majority of P&S syphilis diagnoses occurred in Ouachita Parish and Lincoln Parish.

NEW HIV DIAGNOSES—REGION 8

- In 2013, 77 persons were diagnosed with HIV for a rate of 21.6 per 100,000.
- In 2014, 90 persons were diagnosed with HIV for a rate of 25.3 per 100,000.
- In 2015, **66** persons were diagnosed with HIV for a rate of **18.5** per 100,000. In 2015, Region 8 had the **5th** highest HIV diagnoses rate out of all 9 public health regions in Louisiana.

HIV DIAGNOSES BY SEX AT BIRTH

• In 2013, **75**% of new HIV diagnoses were among males. This proportion dropped to **64**% in 2014 and returned to **76**% in 2015.

HIV BY RACE/ETHNICITY

The proportion of new HIV diagnoses among blacks is increasing in Region 8.

• In 2013, **73**% of all HIV diagnoses were black and **25**% were white. In 2014, **81**% of HIV diagnoses were black and **16**% were white. In 2015, **83**% of the HIV diagnoses were black and **17**% were white.

NEW HIV DIAGNOSES BY AGE GROUP

- From 2013 to 2015, youth age 15-24 years old accounted for 30% of all new HIV diagnoses in Region 8.
- Persons age 25-34 years accounted for an additional 25% of new diagnoses each year.
- From 2013 to 2015, there was an increase of new HIV diagnoses among persons 45 years and older. In 2013, persons 45 and older accounted for just 16% of the new HIV diagnoses but in 2015 they accounted for 33% of the new HIV diagnoses.

NEW HIV DIAGNOSES BY PARISH, 2013-2015

• In 2015, the majority of new HIV diagnoses occurred in Ouachita Parish and Lincoln Parish.

NEW HIV DIAGNOSES BY RISK CATEGORY

• For all new HIV diagnoses from 2013 to 2015, **69%** report being a male who has sex with men (MSM), **4%** report injection drug use (IDU) and an additional **2%** report MSM and IDU. A **quarter** of all new HIV diagnoses are high risk heterosexuals. There were **zero** cases of mother-to-child transmission of HIV in this region from 2013-2015.

In 2014, Louisiana ranked 1st in the nation for Congenital Syphilis rates; 1st for Gonorrhea rates; 2nd for HIV rates; 2nd for AIDS rates; 2nd for Primary and Secondary Syphilis rates, and 3rd for Chlamydia rates.
