


CHLAMYDIA REGION 8

- In 2016, 3,033 persons were diagnosed with chlamydia for a rate of 855.7 per 100,000.
- In 2017, 3,268 persons were diagnosed with chlamydia for a rate of 927.5 per 100,000.
- In 2018, 3,387 persons were diagnosed with chlamydia for a rate of 969.8 per 100,000, a 5% rate increase from 2017.
- In 2018, Region 8 had the 5th highest number of chlamydia diagnoses and the highest diagnosis rate.



CHLAMYDIA BY SEX AT BIRTH

• In 2016, **72**% of chlamydia diagnoses were among females. This proportion decreased to **71**% in 2017 and 2018. In 2018, **29**% of chlamydia diagnoses in Region 8 were among males.

CHLAMYDIA BY RACE/ETHNICITY

Blacks account for at least 80% of chlamydia diagnoses each year in Region 8. Only 37% of Region 8 is black.

- In 2016 and 2017, 80% of chlamydia diagnoses were among blacks, increasing to 82% in 2018.
- In 2016 and 2017, 19% of chlamydia diagnoses were among whites, decreasing to 17% in 2018.
- From 2016 to 2018, 2% of chlamydia diagnoses were among Hispanic/Latinx.

CHLAMYDIA BY AGE AT DIAGNOSIS

The majority of Region 8 chlamydia diagnoses are in persons under the age of 25.

- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 24 and under increased from 74% in 2016 and 2017 to 76% in 2018.
- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 25-34 years was 22% in 2016, 21% in 2017, and 20% in 2018.
- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 35 and older was 5% from 2016 to 2018.

CHLAMYDIA BY PARISH


• From 2016 to 2018, the greatest proportion of chlamydia diagnoses was in Ouachita Parish. From 2016 to 2018, Madison Parish had the highest rate of chlamydia diagnoses in the region.

GONORRHEA—REGION 8

- In 2016, **1,129** persons were diagnosed with gonorrhea for a rate of **318.5** per 100,000.
- In 2017, **1,125** persons were diagnosed with gonorrhea for a rate of **319.3** per 100,000.
- In 2018, **1,174** persons were diagnosed with gonorrhea for a rate of **336.1** per 100,000, a 5% rate increase from 2017.
- In 2018, Region 8 had the 4th highest number of gonorrhea diagnoses and the 2nd highest diagnosis rate in Louisiana.



GONORRHEA BY SEX AT BIRTH

• In 2016, **58**% of gonorrhea diagnoses were among females. This proportion decreased to **53**% in 2017 and 2018. In 2018, **47**% of gonorrhea diagnoses in Region 8 were among males.

GONORRHEA BY RACE/ETHNICITY

Blacks account for the majority of gonorrhea diagnoses each year in Region 8. Only 37% of Region 8 is black.

- In 2016, 85% of gonorrhea diagnoses were among blacks, 82% in 2017, and 87% in 2018.
- In 2016, 15% of gonorrhea diagnoses were among whites, 17% in 2017, and 12% in 2018.
- From 2016 to 2018, less than 1% of gonorrhea diagnoses were among Hispanic/Latinx.

GONORRHEA BY AGE AT DIAGNOSIS

The majority of gonorrhea diagnoses in Region 8 are in persons under the age of 25.

- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 24 and under was 66% in 2016, 65% in 2017, and 67% in 2018.
- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 25-34 years decreased from 26% in 2016 and 2017 to 25% in 2018.
- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 35 and older was 8% in 2016, increasing to 9% in 2017 and 2018.

GONORRHEA BY PARISH


• From 2016 to 2018, the greatest proportion of gonorrhea diagnoses was in Ouachita Parish. In 2016 and 2017, Ouachita Parish had the highest gonorrhea diagnosis rate. In 2018, Lincoln Parish had the highest rate of gonorrhea diagnoses in Region 8.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS—REGION 8

- In 2016, 73 persons were diagnosed with P&S syphilis for a rate of 20.6 per 100,000.
- In 2017, 116 persons were diagnosed with P&S syphilis for a rate of 32.9 per 100,000.
- In 2018, 75 persons were diagnosed with P&S syphilis for a rate of 21.5 per 100,000, a 35% rate decrease from 2017.
- In 2018, Region 8 had the 5th highest number of P&S syphilis diagnoses and the 3rd highest diagnosis rate in Louisiana.



PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY SEX AT BIRTH

• In 2016, **60%** of P&S syphilis diagnoses were among males. This proportion decreased to **59%** in 2017 and 2018. In 2018, **41%** of P&S syphilis diagnoses in Region 8 were among females.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY RACE/ETHNICITY

Blacks account for the majority of P&S syphilis diagnoses each year in Region 8. Only 37% of Region 8 is black.

- In 2016, 86% of P&S syphilis diagnoses were among blacks, 84% in 2017, and 93% in 2018.
- In 2016, 14% of P&S syphilis diagnoses were among whites, 15% in 2017, and 7% in 2018.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY AGE AT DIAGNOSIS

Nearly 50% of new P&S syphilis diagnoses are in persons under 25 years old.

- The proportion of diagnoses among persons under age 25 was 53% in 2016, 39% in 2017, and 47% in 2018.
- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 25-34 years was 29% in 2016, 41% in 2017, and 36% in 2018.
- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 35 and older was 18% in 2016, 20% in 2017, and 17% in 2018.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY PARISH


• From 2016 to 2018, the greatest proportion of new P&S syphilis diagnoses was in Ouachita Parish. In 2016, the highest diagnosis rate was in Jackson Parish. In 2017 and 2018, the highest diagnosis rate was in Lincoln Parish.

NEW HIV DIAGNOSES—REGION 8

- In 2016, **71** persons were diagnosed with HIV for a rate of **20.0** per 100,000.
- In 2017, **61** persons were diagnosed with HIV for a rate of **17.2** per 100,000.
- In 2018, **49** persons were diagnosed with HIV for a rate of **14.0** per 100,000, a 19% rate decrease from 2017.
- In 2018, Region 8 had the 7th highest number of new HIV diagnoses and the 6th highest HIV diagnosis rate in Louisiana.



NEW HIV DIAGNOES BY SEX AT BIRTH

• In 2016, **73**% of new HIV diagnoses were among males. This proportion increased to **77**% in 2017 and **82**% in 2018. In 2018, **18**% of all new HIV diagnoses in Region 8 were among females.

NEW HIV DIAGNOSES BY RACE/ETHNICITY

Blacks account for the majority of new HIV diagnoses each year in Region 8. Only 37% of Region 8 is black.

- In 2016, 72% of new HIV diagnoses were among blacks, 67% in 2017, and 80% in 2018.
- In 2016, 27% of new HIV diagnoses were among whites, 21% in 2017, and 16% in 2018.
- In 2016, 1% of new HIV diagnoses were among Hispanics/Latinx, 8% in 2017, and 2% in 2018.

NEW HIV DIAGNOSES BY AGE AT DIAGNOSIS

In 2018, the majority of new HIV diagnoses in Region 8 are among persons 15-34 years old.

- The proportion of diagnoses among persons under age 25 was 20% in 2016, 26% in 2017, and 41% in 2018.
- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 25-34 years was 38% in 2016, 26% in 2017, and 27% in 2018.
- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 35 and older was 43% in 2016, 48% in 2017, and 32% in 2018.

NEW HIV DIAGNOSES BY PARISH

• In 2018, Quachita Parish had the highest proportion of new cases and Lincoln Parish had the highest rate.

In 2018, Louisiana ranked 3rd in the nation for Congenital Syphilis rates, 2nd for Chlamydia rates, 7th for Primary and Secondary Syphilis rates, and 5th for Gonorrhea rates. In 2017, Louisiana ranked 4th for HIV rates and 3rd for AIDS rates in the US.
