


CHLAMYDIA—REGION 9

- In 2016, 2,772 persons were diagnosed with chlamydia for a rate of 476.9 per 100,000.
- In 2017, 3,077 persons were diagnosed with chlamydia for a rate of 526.8 per 100,000.
- In 2018, **3,193** persons were diagnosed with chlamydia for a rate of **542.8** per 100,000, a 3% rate increase from 2017
- In 2018, Region 9 had the 6th highest number of chlamydia diagnoses and the lowest diagnosis rate in Louisiana.



CHLAMYDIA BY SEX AT BIRTH

• In 2016, **76%** of chlamydia diagnoses were among females. This proportion decreased to **75%** in 2017 and **71%** in 2018. In 2018, **29%** of chlamydia diagnoses in Region 9 were among males.

CHLAMYDIA BY RACE/ETHNICITY

Over 50% of new chlamydia diagnoses are among blacks. Only 17% of Region 9 is black.

- In 2016, 53% of chlamydia diagnoses were among blacks, 51% in 2017, and 53% in 2018.
- In 2016, 43% of chlamydia diagnoses were among whites, 45% in 2017, and 43% in 2018.
- In 2016, 3% of chlamydia diagnoses were among Hispanic/Latinx, 4% in 2017, and 3% in 2018.

CHLAMYDIA BY AGE AT DIAGNOSIS

Almost three-quarters of Region 9 chlamydia diagnoses are in persons under the age of 25.

- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 24 and under was **74%** in 2016, **73%** in 2017, and **72%** in 2018.
- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 25-34 years was 21% in 2016 and 2017, increasing to 22% in 2018.
- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 35 and older was 5% in 2016 and 2017, increasing to 6% in 2018.

CHLAMYDIA BY PARISH

 From 2016 to 2018, Tangipahoa Parish had the greatest proportion of chlamydia diagnoses and the highest chlamydia diagnosis rate in the region. From 2016 to 2018, the number of diagnoses in Region 9 increased in all parishes.



GONORRHEA—REGION 9

- In 2016, **849** persons were diagnosed with gonorrhea for a rate of **146.1** per 100,000.
- In 2017, 869 persons were diagnosed with gonorrhea for a rate of 148.8 per 100,000.
- In 2018, **904** persons were diagnosed with gonorrhea for a rate of **153.7** per 100,000, a 4% rate increase from 2017
- In 2018, Region 9 had the 6th highest number of gonorrhea diagnoses and the lowest diagnosis rate in Louisiana.



GONORRHEA BY SEX AT BIRTH

• In 2016, **61%** of gonorrhea diagnoses were among females. This proportion decreased to **57%** in 2017 and to **55%** in 2018. In 2018, **45%** of gonorrhea diagnoses in Region 9 were among males.

GONORRHEA BY RACE/ETHNICITY

Blacks account for 60% or more of the gonorrhea diagnoses each year in Region 9. Only 17% of Region 9 is black.

- In 2016, 60% of gonorrhea diagnoses were among blacks, increasing to 65% in 2017 and 2018.
- In 2016, 38% of gonorrhea diagnoses were among whites, 33% in 2017, and 34% in 2018.
- In 2016, 1% of gonorrhea diagnoses were among Hispanic/Latinx, 2% in 2017, and 1% in 2018.

GONORRHEA BY AGE AT DIAGNOSIS

More than half of gonorrhea diagnoses in Region 9 are in persons under the age of 25.

- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 24 and under was 65% in 2016, 61% in 2017, and 55% in 2018.
- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 25-34 years was 25% in 2016, 27% in 2017, and 33% in 2018.
- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 35 and older was 10% in 2016, increasing to 12% in 2017 and 2018.

GONORRHEA BY PARISH

• From 2016 to 2018, the greatest proportion of gonorrhea diagnoses and the highest diagnosis rates were in Tangipahoa Parish.



PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS—REGION 9

- In 2016, 20 persons were diagnosed with P&S syphilis for a rate of 3.4 per 100,000.
- In 2017, **30** persons were diagnosed with P&S syphilis for a rate of **5.1** per 100,000.
- In 2018, **29** persons were diagnosed with P&S syphilis for a rate of **4.9** per 100,000, a 4% rate decrease from 2017
- In 2018, Region 9 had the **7th** highest number of P&S syphilis diagnoses and the **7th** highest diagnosis rate in Louisiana.



PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY SEX AT BIRTH

• In 2016, **95**% of P&S syphilis diagnoses were among males. This proportion decreased to **93**% in 2017 and **76**% in 2018. In 2018, **24**% of P&S syphilis diagnoses in Region 9 were among females.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY RACE/ETHNICITY

Blacks account for 30% or more of new P&S syphilis diagnoses in Region 9. Blacks make up 17% of the population.

- In 2016, 30% of P&S syphilis diagnoses were among blacks, 33% in 2017, and 41% in 2018.
- In 2016, 65% of P&S syphilis diagnoses were among whites, 53% in 2017, and 55% in 2018.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY AGE AT DIAGNOSIS

Persons under the age of 25 account for the greatest proportion of new diagnoses in Region 9.

- The proportion of diagnoses among persons under age 25 was 40% in 2016, 50% in 2017, and 38% in 2018.
- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 25-34 years was 35% in 2016, 27% in 2017, and 21% in 2018.
- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 35 and older was 25% in 2016, 23% in 2017, and 41% in 2018.

PRIMARY & SECONDARY SYPHILIS BY PARISH


• From 2016 to 2018, the greatest proportion of new P&S syphilis diagnoses were in St. Tammany Parish. In 2016, the highest diagnosis rate was in St. Tammany Parish and in 2017 it was in Tangipahoa Parish. In 2018, Washington Parish had the highest diagnosis rate.

NEW HIV DIAGNOSES—REGION 9

- In 2016, **69** persons were diagnosed with HIV for a rate of **11.9** per 100,000.
- In 2017, **70** persons were diagnosed with HIV for a rate of **12.0** per 100,000.
- In 2018, **66** persons were diagnosed with HIV for a rate of **11.2** per 100,000, an 7% rate decrease from 2017.
- In 2018, Region 9 had the 6th highest number of new HIV diagnoses and the lowest HIV diagnosis rate in Louisiana.



NEW HIV DIAGNOSES BY SEX AT BIRTH

• In 2016, **72%** of new HIV diagnoses were among males. This proportion increased to **76%** in 2017 and decreased to **73%** in 2018. In 2018, **27%** of all new diagnoses in Region 9 were among females.

NEW HIV DIAGNOSES BY RACE/ETHNICITY

Blacks account for over half of the new HIV diagnoses each year in Region 9. Only 17% of Region 9 is black.

- In 2016, 52% of new HIV diagnoses were among blacks, 60% in 2017, and 58% in 2018.
- In 2016, 42% of new HIV diagnoses were among whites, 34% in 2017, and 38% in 2018.
- In 2016, 6% of new HIV diagnoses were among Hispanic/Latinx, 6% in 2017, and 3% in 2018.

NEW HIV DIAGNOSES BY AGE AT DIAGNOSIS

In 2018, the greatest proportion of new diagnoses were among persons 35 and older.

- The proportion of diagnoses among persons under age 25 was 13% in 2016, 27% in 2017, 15% in 2018.
- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 25-34 years was 49% in 2016, 29% in 2017, 27% in 2018.
- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 35-44 years was 16% in 2016, 14% in 2017, 27% in 2018.
- The proportion of diagnoses among persons 45 and older was 22% in 2016, 30% in 2017, 30% in 2018.

NEW HIV DIAGNOSES BY PARISH

• In 2018, the greatest proportion of new HIV diagnoses was in Tangipahoa Parish and the highest rate of new HIV diagnoses was in Washington Parish.

In 2018, Louisiana ranked 3rd in the nation for Congenital Syphilis rates, 2nd for Chlamydia rates, 7th for Primary and Secondary Syphilis rates, and 5th for Gonorrhea rates. In 2017, Louisiana ranked 4th for HIV rates and 3rd for AIDS rates in the US.
