## GET READY FOR DECADENCE!

### HAVE A GOOD TIME AND HAVE A PLAN! HERE'S HOW TO GAUGE YOUR RISK OF GETTING OR SPREADING MONKEYPOX

MOST RISKY

- Direct contact with infectious rash, scabs or body fluids
- Intimate contact
- All forms of sexual contact (NOTE: condoms do not reliably protect against transmission)

MORE RISKY

- KissingCuddling
- Dancing at a crowded party <u>inside</u> with non-fully clothed people

Sharing drinks
 Sharing a bad

Sharing a bed, towels or personal toiletry items

**POSSIBLE** 

UNLIKELY

Dancing at a crowded party <u>inside</u> with fully clothed people

· Dancing at a party outside with mostly clothed people

Co-worker to co-worker transmission

- Trying on clothing at a store
- Touching a doorknobTraveling in an airport or on an airplane
- In a swimming pool, hot tub or other body of water
- In public restrooms or on public transit
- At a grocery store, coffee shop or gym (via equipment)

## MONKEYPOX FAC

#### WHAT IS MONKEYPOX?

Monkeypox is a potentially serious viral illness that typically involves flu-like symptoms, swelling of the lymph nodes and a rash that includes bumps that are initially filled with fluid before scabbing over. Illness could be confused with a sexually transmitted infection like syphilis or herpes, or with chickenpox.

#### **WHAT ARE THE SYMPTOMS?**

- Fever
  - Headache
  - Chills

- Muscle aches and backache
- Swollen lymph nodes
- Exhaustion
- A possibly painful rash that can look like pimples or blisters that appear on the face, inside the mouth and/or other parts of the body, like the hands, feet, chest, genitals or anus

Symptoms usually appear 1-2 weeks after exposure. Sometimes people get a rash first, followed by other symptoms. Others only experience a rash. Some cases in the current U.S. outbreak have experienced only isolated rashes in the genital region or other body parts. Illness typically lasts 2-4 weeks.

#### WHAT IF I HAVE SYMPTOMS?

- Contact your healthcare provider right away and ask about testing, or contact a local provider in this guide.
- Avoid sex or other close, intimate contact.
- If you test positive, isolate until your rash has healed, all scabs have fallen off and a fresh layer of intact skin has formed.
