The Benefits of Shelf Talker Usage

Shelf Talkers provide advantages for both Vendors and WIC Participants, including assisting WIC participants during their shopping, identifying problem items, improving the shopping experience, and increasing WIC sales. Additionally, Shelf Talkers are the most commonly requested in-store shopping resource from WIC participants. LA WIC has updated its policies and procedures to promote and encourage the use of Shelf Talkers . Policy states "Vendors may indicate an item is WIC Approved (with or without the shelf talker image(s) provided by LA WIC) on a WIC Approved Food Item's printed shelf price label." We recently used funding from the Shopping Experience Grant to print Shelf Talkers, which we will mail free of charge to LA WIC Vendors.

WIC Modernization Grant-Shopping Experience Grant

LA WIC was awarded funds for the Shopping Experience Improvement Grant and the WIC Modernization Grant by the USDA. LA WIC will use grant funding to improve the participant shopping experience by designing, developing, and implementing targeted training and resources for WIC participants, Vendors, and WIC program staff. Successful implementation of grants initiatives will lead to increased Participant satisfaction with the WIC shopping experience and an increase in the percentage of benefits redeemed by WIC Participants, including the highly popular cash value benefit.

LA WIC will utilize grant funds to provide Vendors with the materials and resources they need to be successful when assisting WIC Participants. <u>LA WIC will launch a Vendor Materials Request Form in the next few weeks.</u> This form will allow Vendors to order Shelf Talkers, Window Clings, Food List Brochures, Transaction Procedures (WIC-33), Minimum Stock Requirements (WIC-23), and Vendor Training Cards.

Raydiant Kiosks

To enhance the WIC shopping experience for both WIC Participants and Vendors, LA WIC is pleased to introduce the innovative Raydiant kiosk. This state-of-the-art solution aims to streamline the shopping process while increasing awareness of the WIC program and its benefits. The Raydiant kiosk will modernize the way WIC shoppers utilize their benefits in your store.

To kick start this exciting initiative, LA WIC is planning a pilot program involving approximately 20 stores statewide. We extend an invitation to your store to participate in this opportunity and be among the first to provide your WIC shoppers with this innovative technology.

Key points for vendors regarding the kiosk installation:

- There is no cost to have a Raydiant Kiosk installed in your store and store personnel will not be required to provide any support or assistance during installation.
- The installation of LA WIC Raydiant kiosks is expected to take place in August/September 2023.
- Raydiant will offer 24/7 customer service support via email and phone for any kiosk-related issues. Most problems can be resolved remotely. If on-site support is necessary, Raydiant will manage it.



To Be A Successful Vendor

"Do the right thing even when you think no one is looking. It's called integrity" - unknown Vendors serve a valuable role in supporting the health of women, infants, and children in Louisiana by ensuring that WIC participants have access to nutritious food items approved by WIC. Successful partnership and collaboration between and our Authorized WIC Vendors serves to improve the accessibility and ease of shopping for WIC approved food items.

Obtaining accurate vendor information during onboarding (authorization) and monitoring processes can significantly impact your success as a Vendor. If there are any changes to your store, it is important to inform LA WIC promptly via email. Vendors are indispensable in achieving the overall success of the Louisiana WIC Program. Modernizing WIC to Meet the Needs of Participants

Over the past five decades, the WIC program has made progress in its mission to enhance the well-being of pregnant and postpartum women, infants, and children under 5 years old. This program has had a positive impact on communities and health outcomes by providing nutritious foods to supplement the dietary needs of participants. The effectiveness of the WIC program is evident in its service to 6.2 million individuals, with approximately 95k participants in Louisiana.

On February 23, 2023, the USDA and Food and Nutrition Service introduced a Proposed Rule called "WIC Online Ordering and Transactions and Food Delivery Revisions to Meet the Needs of a Modern, Data-Driven Program." The purpose of this rule is to increase WIC's participation rate. Under this proposed rule, LA WIC vendors will be allowed to facilitate online shopping for WIC-approved foods. The aim is to improve the WIC shopping experience and ensure that WIC participants have equal access to nutritious foods. LA WIC Authorized Vendors will benefit from this proposed rule as it also grants state agencies the authority to approve new types of online vendors.

Presently, the Gretchen Swanson Center for Nutrition, located in Omaha, Nebraska, is working on a safe and secure model for online ordering in WIC to assist state agencies in future online shopping projects. Their goal is to provide technical support and documentation in an effort to improve the redemption process for WIC participants and enhance their overall experience.

UPC for Pre-Packaged or Bagged Fresh Fruits & Veggies

To enhance the shopping experience for LA WIC participants, LA WIC is implementing a new process for Vendors to add UPCs (Universal Product Codes) for pre-packaged or bagged fresh fruits and vegetables to the LA WIC Approved Product List (APL). Vendors are asked to submit these requests using the <u>LA WIC UPC Request Form</u>, available on the <u>LA WIC Vendor Hub</u> website.

Here are a few important points to keep in mind:

- The USDA still requires Vendors to map UPCs for pre-packaged or bagged WIC approved produce that does not register as WIC eligible at the register.
- LA WIC will NOT accept UPC requests for type 2 UPCs, which are store-specific UPC numbers beginning with 2, 4, or 9. Vendors are responsible for mapping these UPCs individually.
- It is essential that your store staff be trained to report any instances where pre-packaged or bagged fresh fruits and vegetables do not scan as WIC approved at the register. Please notify the appropriate corporate/store contact for mapping purposes.

Additionally, we would like to gather information on your store's utilization of Global Trade Item Numbers (GS1) codes for fresh produce. GS1 (GTINs) are a worldwide standard for identifying produce and can be used by WIC vendors for fresh produce as well. If your store employs GTIN codes, please inform us, and LA WIC will work towards adding those items to the API.

Things to Remember

LA WIC Infant Formula Substitutions Waivers

All USDA waivers have expired. Previously implemented by LA WIC In response to shortages due to the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and the Abbott formula recall, the USDA granted several waivers to the Louisiana WIC Program (LA WIC) in an effort to allow the program increased flexibility to respond to the recall. Please refer to the LA WIC Vendor Hub for more information.

Reauthorization

Authorized Vendors in Trade Area 1 must reapply for LA WIC Vendor authorization. Trade Area 1 includes all Vendors in Regions 2,4, & 5. Reauthorization applications must be submitted between July 1-July 31. All Vendors in Trade Area 1 were sent an email with instructions for reauthorization on June 30, 2023.

<u>Temporary Minimum Stock Requirements</u>

The Temporary Minimum Stock Requirements will expire on September 30, 2023. Effective October 1, 2023, LA WIC will use the Minimum Stock Requirements effective December 7, 2022.
